

Do You Recognize This Car?

May to September

Sal Lorino's northern '66 convertible
travels summertime only.

Ever notice how many Mustangs winning show trophies and appearing in magazines are from the south or California? Northern cars take a beating

every year in snow, ice, and road salt. Folks who live in more temperate climates often don't understand what a "full" restoration entails. Because of rust and basic structural damage, it is rare for a car driven through numerous northern winters to become a show vehicle. Sal Lorino's Candyapple Red '66 Mustang convertible is an exception, but it took some work.

When Lorino saw the car a few years ago he was interested in its potential for restoration. He'd already done cosmetic restorations on a '70 Mustang convertible and a '65 hardtop, but this time he wanted to do the whole job, from the engine out.

The '66—at a price of \$899—looked like a bargain. It had perfect wire wheel covers and its interior was in very good condition. There were enough salvageable parts that Sal, a Milwaukee truck driver, knew he couldn't lose on the deal. With full restoration the true goal and with the help of Mustang specialist Mark Lien, of Mark's Auto Body Shop in Milwaukee, and Dick Doria, a founder of Wisconsin

Early Mustangers, Lorino was able to reach his goal quickly. With some added luck in finding parts, the time from purchase to completion was less than six months.

It was not easy. When Sal saw how the car looked after he started tearing it apart, he probably would not have predicted that the restoration job could be done so quickly. "The floors were practically gone," he said. "We sandblasted the tub, and it looked like a Swiss cheese. Mark welded completely new panels in there." The inner frame rails, rear frame rails, floors, torque boxes, outer wheel houses, trunk floors, and quarter panels all had to be replaced.

"Compared to a rust-free southern car that doesn't need to be touched, a lot more money and work goes into making a car like this solid," said Mark Lien. "This car had been a daily driver up here. Southern cars never experience this kind of deterioration. It was a basket case and we were able to turn it into a potential First Place winner."

When Lorino bought the car it showed 85,700 miles. The 289 engine smoked a little and the automatic transmission had some problems in reverse. He called upon Dick Doria to rebuild his engine, and that's where luck played a part. Sal was able to purchase a large cache of original parts which were used in the

factory-spec and blueprinted engine, and rebuilding the brake system. Included in the engine work were forged aluminum piston and Clevis 77 bearings, multi-purpose bearings with near-racing capability.

Sal claims he was happy to do the rough work and let the pros handle the rest. "As nice as the Mustang looks," he adds, "the best part is how it drives and handles." The good looks have paid off in numerous First Place trophies. The convertible also was featured in a western theme TV commercial aired nationally to promote a chain of drug stores. "A pretty good record for a car that was one step away from the graveyard," said Sal. The car was completed in the middle of a Milwaukee winter, but its first day out was a great sign: the temperature climbed to 62 degrees, and the Lorino family was able to drop the top for a celebration drive. That was the first and last wintertime excursion for the restored Mustang. It's still up north, and its semi-retired season goes May to September only.
